

<u>Prolife Corner</u> Matt & Georgene Ulrich - Council 676's Prolife Family

"God calls us to be faithful, not successful." Mother Teresa's words when she spoke at the National Prayer breakfast years ago. Probably one of the most quoted statements I have heard in the ProLife mission to defend life for the past 20 years Georgene and I have been active. Another statement the incredible Mother Teresa made "How much does an abortion cost? One human Life". On September 4th, Mother Teresa will be canonized a saint in Rome and what a saint she was. I remember story after story about her prolife efforts, and one that stands out was Mother and her Sisters of Charity going to the hospitals in India where they performed abortions and telling these abortion minded women "if you don't want your baby, we will take your baby". They would find homes for these unwanted children without exception. I could tell you many other prolife activities she and the Sisters of Charity performed every day, In America she exclaimed "how can we ever stop the crime in our streets, when we let mothers kill the children in their womb". One of the powerful saints we go to for ending abortion in our prayers, and prayer is ultimately what will end abortion, that's not from me only, but the prolife stalwarts that pray daily to the Holy Spirit to stop the killing of Gods precious infants.

Some experts suggest that there are four phases of retirement: protection, accumulation, income de-accumulation and care. In this article, I will tackle protection.


