In memory of Matt, we will be revisiting some of his past posts.

I want to share with you a personal experience. Two weeks ago my wife, Georgene, and I were invited to a dinner party with two other couples. After dinner and during the conversation someone mentioned that I pray the rosary at abortion clinics in Seattle. No big deal—right! For the past four years I have followed this practice and not too many people know about it. Personally, I don't publicize it because it makes some people uncomfortable. Someone made the comment that I am wasting my time praying to end abortion because abortion will be available always to anyone who wants one. That comment pushed my button, but I responded in the only way that I could without getting into a heated argument. I said that as long as innocent babies are being killed without being able to speak out. I will pray for them with all my heart and with all my soul, and my prayers will be answered.
